The programme of events formed the 'Strathfovle One Big Clean Up Week' 2019, engaging 47 young people between 14 and 17 years of age. 71 people, including young children and families. participated in the 'Window Box Challenge' event at Strathfovle Library, which was a great success.



"10 amazing volunteers, aged 65-80 have, for the past six years, taken part in the Creggan Country Park 'Biodiversity On Your Doorstep' Project, This project addresses social isolation and loneliness in older people living in care homes by using environmental volunteering as a tool. They created willow domes, wildlife murals, window boxes and bird feeders to transform the view from residents windows, particularly the bed bound. These social spaces encourage residents to go outdoors to help improve their mental health.

The group faced a bereavement in early 2018 with the loss of an amazing woman - Ann Sandy. Ann continued volunteering through ill health. Volunteers never let their own personal challenges prevent them from helping their community as they continue to battle ill health and limited mobility."
